SENIOR TIMELINE

OCTOBER

- Register for SAT/ACT/SAT subject tests (if required)
- Finalize college list (Reach, Good Match, & Safety)
- Visit prospective colleges and go to District College Fair, October 19th, 6-8 PM (Over 60 college reps & FREE workshops for parents and students)
- Work on any college application writing prompts

NOVEMBER

- UC & CSU applications DUE November 30th!
- CSU EOP Application DUE November 30th!
- Attend afterschool college application workshops with the counselors
- Start Financial Aid applications (FAFSA/DREAM Act). Get checked by counselors before submitting.

DECEMBER-FEBRUARY

- Complete FAFSA/DREAM Act application.
- Apply for scholarships (Career Center maintains a monthly printed SCHOLARSHIP BULLETIN & online bulletin on their website www.tinyurl.com/SGHS-CC)
- Check e-mail/college student portals to make sure that all requirements and college requests are met

MARCH-MAY

- CalGrant/ FAFSA/Dream Act DUE March 2nd!
- Once you've received all of your responses from colleges, make your final decision! But, don't forget to verify your financial aid before you make any college budget decisions.
- Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) May 1st.
- Prepare for your AP exams and complete your AP tests before summer.
- Send your final transcripts to your college and meet housing deadlines.
- GRADUATION!!! May 31st!

How Much Aid Will you Need for the School You Choose?

Your chosen school's cost of attendance (COA)
– Your Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

= Your financial need



COA = tuition, fees, living costs, transportation, books, and personal expenses. Once you determine your need, respond to the aid offers. Submit all required documents & deposits by the deadlines!

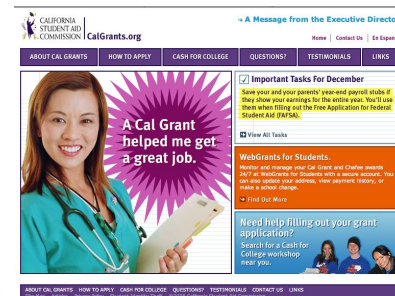

Cal Grants = Free Money!

Cal Grant Application = FAFSA or Dream Act application

- FAFSA
 - Application window: **October 1st – March 2nd**
- Cal Grant GPA Verification submit by school
- Must renew every year!!
- Senior grades count !



TYPES OF LOANS

- **Unsubsidized Loans:** You pay all interest from the moment you start borrowing. You can defer payments until you graduate.
- **Subsidized_Direct Loan:** Federal government pays the interest while you are in college.

Cal Grant GPA Opt-Out Form

California public high schools are required to submit a Cal Grant high school Grade Point Average (GPA) for all graduating seniors, unless the student or parent has opted out of the submission process, no later than October 1. California Education Code section 69432.9 requires the school district or charter school, no later than January 1 of a pupil's grade 11 academic year, to notify, in writing, each grade 11 pupil and his or her parent or guardian that the pupil will be deemed a Cal Grant applicant unless the pupil is opted out prior to the high school's submission of GPAs to the Commission. Students who do not opt out will have their GPA submitted to the Commission to be considered for a Cal Grant award. If you do not want your school to report a GPA, please complete this form and return it to your high school counselor.

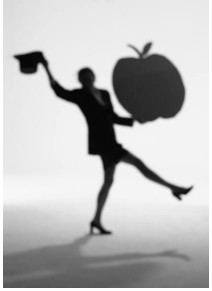

AB 540

AB540: Undocumented students (not a U.S. citizen) can qualify for in-state tuition rates at public colleges

1. Attend a California High School for three (3) or more years
2. Graduate from a California high school or earn an GED
3. Register at an accredited public institution of higher education in California.
4. Sign a statement (affidavit) with the college or university (NOT with INS) stating that you will apply for legal residency with the INS as soon as he/she is able to do so.
5. Special presentation at Cash for College (December 2nd at MKHS)

How Do I Qualify for FAFSA (Free Application For Student Aid)

1. Must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in eligible school
2. Must be pursuing degree, certificate or other recognized credential
3. Must be U.S. citizen or legal resident
4. Must be registered with selective service (required if male and 18 years old)



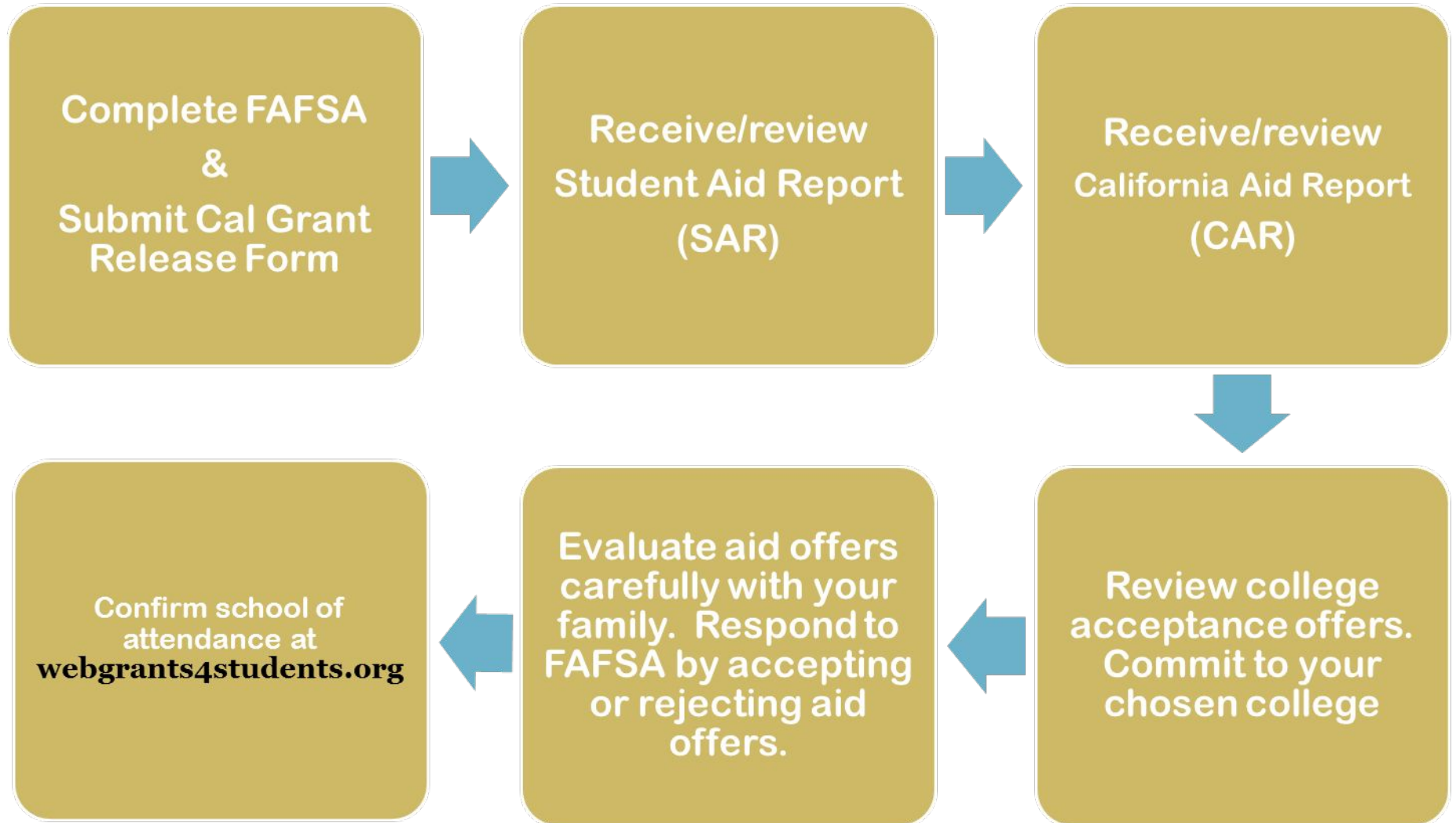

Apply for FAFSA

- www.fafsa.ed.gov
- FAFSA collects family's financial information used to calculate student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
- List the **MOST COSTLY** school in California FIRST on FAFSA (you can list up to 10 schools).
- List those with the earliest financial aid deadlines first.
- FAFSA should be started on **October 1, 2017!**
- **March 2, 2018** is the DEADLINE!

How to activate and retain your Cal Grant award:

- Log on to www.webgrants4students.org and create your WebGrants for Students account. This is how you view the status and terms of your Cal Grant, make school changes and request a leave of absence. To retain your award, it is very important to keep your account information current.
- If the first school listed above is not the school you plan to attend, when you decide on the school you will attend, please log on to your WebGrants for Students account and change your school of attendance.
- If your Cal Grant award does not appear on your financial aid award notification from your school, contact the college Financial Aid Office at the school you plan to attend and notify them of your Cal Grant offer.
- To be eligible for this Entitlement Cal Grant award, you must have satisfied all high school graduation requirements. In late spring, CSAC will be requesting confirmation of your high school graduation.
- Go to www.webgrants4students.org and read the Important Facts About Your Cal Grant fact sheet. This contains important information on how to activate, retain and renew your Cal Grant award offer.

If you have been offered a Cal Grant A and you choose to attend a California Community College, you will not receive any payments while attending community college. Instead, CSAC will hold the potential grant in a status called Community College Reserve for up to two years and, potentially, for an additional year with an extension request from the student. You may activate the Cal Grant A award by putting a school change request on WebGrants and by attending in an AA or BA/BS program at a non-community college in California. To keep your eligibility for a Community College Reserve award, you must be enrolled for the fall term 2009-10.

2018-19 CSS Profile Student Guide

This guide provides the basic information you need to complete your CSS Profile application at cssprofile.org starting Oct. 1, 2017.

WHAT is the CSS Profile?

The **CSS Profile** is an online application that collects information used by nearly 400 colleges and scholarship programs to award non-federal aid. (For federal aid you must complete the FAFSA, available Oct. 1 at fafsa.ed.gov.) Some colleges may require the CSS Profile from both biological/adoptive parents in cases of divorce or separation.

WHEN do I complete the CSS Profile?

You may complete the CSS Profile as early as Oct. 1, 2017. You should submit no later than two weeks before the EARLIEST priority filing date specified by your colleges.

WHO must complete the CSS Profile?

Check your colleges' information to determine whether they require the CSS Profile. A list of participating colleges is also found on the CSS Profile Homepage.

HOW do I complete the CSS Profile?

You submit the CSS Profile at cssprofile.org. Once you sign in, you will find a list of useful documents, such as your federal tax returns and other financial information that you'll need to have at hand to complete the application. Help is provided within the application and additional help is available by chat, phone, or email by clicking "Contact Us" in the application.

WHAT does the CSS Profile cost?

The fee for the initial application is \$26. Additional reports are \$16. Payment may be made via credit or debit card. Fee waivers may be granted to domestic students who are first-time college applicants and who have used a SAT fee waiver, have an income of \$45,000 or less, or are an orphan or ward of the court under the age of 24. This waiver covers the application fee and the reporting fees for up to eight colleges.

The Process:

1. **Sign-in** – Use your College Board username and password or sign up for a new account. If you created an account for the SAT or to view your PSAT or AP scores, you should use the same user name and password for your CSS Profile application.
2. **Complete the Application** – As you answer questions, the system builds an application tailored to your family's situation. The application provides online help and edits to guide you. You do not need to complete the application in one sitting; save your application and return to complete it at any time.
3. **Submit the Application** – The date and time you submit your completed application will be recorded based on Eastern Time and your reports will be sent to the colleges you selected.
4. **Review Your Dashboard** – Once you submit your application, your dashboard will include your payment receipt and any next steps, such as submitting documents to the Institutional Documentation Service (IDOC).

You may add a college at any time. Sign in to the CSS Profile and click **Add a College or Program** on your Dashboard. You will be charged \$16 for each college you add. Any unused fee waivers will be automatically applied to your charges.
