CSU Eligibility Index

- You must meet minimum eligibility requirements to apply to a UC or a CSU. Please refer to the eligibility index so you can calculate your GPA and SAT scores to determine eligibility.
- Remember that meeting eligibility *does not* guarantee you a spot in the college of your choice.
- Remember to apply to a “safe” or backup school!

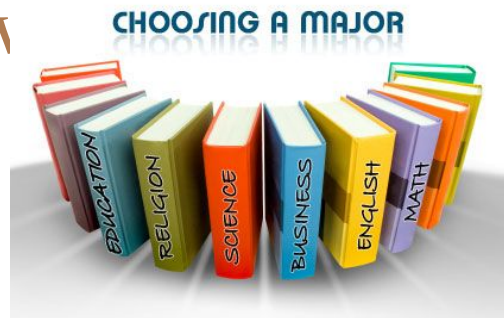

EOP

Educational Opportunity Program

EOP is a support program for undergraduate students who need admission assistance and support services to succeed in college.

Who may be eligible?

- Low-income or educationally disadvantaged students (meet income guidelines)
- First generation students
- California residents
- Must be approved by the EOP selection committee based on educational background

For UC Schools: Short answer space is within the main UC application.

For CSU: You will be asked if you want to apply within your application. You will need two recommendation forms from two non-family adults who know you best.

EOP can provide:

- Special admission consideration
- Financial aid assistance
- Orientation to college
- Academic advising, counseling, and peer advising
- Writing and college transition course (EOP 100)
- Career counseling
- Tutoring
- Graduate placement information
- Priority deadline is November 30th

- Admission is extremely competitive
- Application is now open at universityofcalifornia.edu
- Submit November 1 – November 30!

How are UC applications evaluated?

14 Factors Considered:

- **Academic grade point average** in all completed "a-g" courses, including additional points for completed UC-certified honors courses.
- **Scores** on the following tests: ACT Plus Writing or the SAT Reasoning Test.
- Number of, content of and performance in **academic courses** beyond the minimum "a-g" requirements.
- Number of and performance in **UC-approved honors, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate Higher Level** and transferable college courses.
- Identification by UC as being ranked in the **top 9 percent** of your high school class at the end of your junior year (Eligible in the Local Context, or ELC).
- **Quality of your senior-year program** as measured by the type and number of academic courses in progress or planned.
- **Quality of your academic performance** relative to the educational opportunities available in your high school.
- **Outstanding performance** in one or more specific subject areas.
- **Outstanding work** in one or more special projects in any academic field of study.

How are UC applications evaluated?

- Recent, marked **improvement** in academic performance as demonstrated by academic GPA and the quality of coursework completed or in progress.
- **Special talents, achievements and awards** in a particular field, special skills, special interests, experiences that demonstrate unusual promise for leadership or other significant experiences or achievements that demonstrate the student's promise for contributing to the intellectual vitality of a campus.
- Completion of **special projects** undertaken in the context of your high school curriculum or in conjunction with special school events, projects or programs.
- **Academic accomplishments in light of your life experiences and special circumstances**, including but not limited to: disabilities, low family income, first generation to attend college, need to work, disadvantaged social or educational environment, difficult personal and family situations or circumstances, refugee status or veteran status.
- **Location** of your secondary school and residence.

Activities Tips for UC/Private App

See handout before describing your activities!

Tip #2: Emphasize tangible, measurable impact.

Whom did your activity help? How many people? How much money did you raise?

Instead of:

Raised money for children in Africa.

Try: Raised \$3,000 to provide three uniforms and scholarships for students attending the Joseph Waweru Home School in Kenya



Private Schools

- They have their own deadlines and requirements.
- Some have a “No Loan” policy.
- Many require an additional financial aid application – The CSS Profile.
- Recommendation letters are usually required.
- Many private schools are on commonapp.org
- Many schools require supplemental essays



Recommendation Letters

Must fill out a blue student information packet.
(available in the Counseling Office)

October 31st is the deadline to give your student information packet to your counselor.

Your packet must be turned in 2 weeks prior to your first deadline.

**Ask for a recommendation letter only if you
are serious about attending a
private school.**

Application Fee Waivers



UC/CSU

- Fee Waivers eligibility is determined within the online application
- It is crucial that the financial information you provide is accurate as the system does not allow you to “go back” once it has registered your financial information
- A supplemental application is available for fee waivers that cannot be determined within the online application

Private Schools

- College Board Fee Waivers are sent to you digitally once you have used an SAT Fee Waiver.
- You can also request fee waivers on Common App

STOP!!!! Read this before you apply!

1. Create a new **email address** (an appropriate one) to be used for only college/financial aid.
2. Check this email address weekly.
3. Remember to **capitalize** your name, address, etc. on your applications. Use your official name.
4. List 12th grade 1st semester courses as **IN PROGRESS (IP)** and 2nd semester courses as **PLANNED (PL)**.
5. Your **CA SSID** can be found on your transcript next to your AUSD ID number.
6. Enter your **grades** exactly as they appear on your transcript. Our school district does not give plus/minus grades.
7. List **repeated courses/grades** in the year you took them; not in place of your original course/grade. For UCs, you must list BOTH courses/grades.
8. **Do not open multiple CSU applications. Complete one application and then the information will repopulate to the next application you open.**
9. AP Government is a fall semester class. 2nd semester, it is Economics. **Not AP Economics.**
10. Government goes in the Social Science section. Economics goes in the College Prep Elective section. They are both semester long classes.
11. Only use courses on the A-G course list. Culinary arts, peer counseling, conflict mediation, leadership, PE, etc. are not on this list and do not go on your application.
12. See your counselor if you find that you need to type in your classes. They should all be in the drop down boxes.
13. Remember that **EOP** requires an additional application that needs to be completed after you submit your CSU application. You should submit your Cal State EOP applications by November 30th.
14. UC/CSU application **fee waivers** are embedded in the application. There is nothing to get from your counselor.
15. Do your college applications **BEFORE** your financial aid application.
16. When you submit your Cal State application, you will first be sent an **activation code**. You need to retrieve that code from your email and enter it in on your application. THEN you can submit. If you don't enter the activation code, your application was not submitted!
17. You will get emails from the schools to which you applied asking you to set up your **portals**. This is where you will find future communications from your colleges. You need to set up your portals, find the "**To Do List**" in each portal, and make sure you accomplish all of the tasks asked of you. If you don't check your portal, you will miss important deadlines. **If you miss a DEADLINE, you will have your admission REVOKED.** Check your portals weekly!

- Feel suspicious? Trust your instinct.

Application Timeline

November 30 th	UC and Cal State Applications are due! EOP applications are also due.
Early January	Deadline for the Cal States to have received your SAT/ACT scores
<u>Mid January</u>	Send 7 th semester transcripts to the colleges that are requesting them.
March 2 nd	Financial Aid applications are due
May 1 st	Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) is due!

SAT: Send one score report to California State University, Mentor (3594)






















ACT: As of right now, scores need to be sent to each individual campus. This may change in the next few months.

Important: If you are taking the October or December ACT, please use the 4 free score reports on your registration. You can send your score to 1 UC and use the other 3 score reports as needed. If you wait to send your scores after the test, it will cost you money.
